The Word became flesh (John 1:14) so that

condemned sinners, and die for us that we
might be made righteous in him (2
Corinthians 5:21). He was born outside a
village and he died outside a city. “He was
in the world, and the world was made
through him, yet the world did not know
him” (John 1:10).

As Advent season begins again, call to mind
the only detail the Holy Spirit, who inspired
Luke's writing, decided to provide us about
the actual birth of Jesus: Mary had to lay
him in a manger because there was no
room for them in the inn.

It is no less ironic that Jesus can stand on
the periphery of our busy Advent activities
than it was that he, the Son of David, lay in
a manger in a field on the periphery of the
city of David.

Therefore, as we plan our Advent season,
“let every heart prepare him room.”
